	<ul> <li>No report received – however an updated report has been received from the PCSO subsequent to the meeting which show reported police incidents continue to be low in the area.</li> </ul>	
391.2	<ul> <li>County Councillor</li> <li>Due to diary clashes Andrew Saywell presented his report at the beginning of the meeting, but is reported here for continuity.</li> <li>Fuel update – back to normal, services not too disrupted thankfully</li> <li>BUS ROUTE FUNDING - £34m bid to Govt. Would include new strategic routes through Torrington one connecting to the railway line at Umberleigh, possibly to express service to Tiverton Parkway but details TBC</li> <li>Reopening of Okehampton railway line, on 20<sup>th</sup> November</li> <li>Covid</li> <li>We are seeing an increase in numbers of people testing positive with Covid driven by and large by young people (secondary age). Torridge is currently at 452 per 100,000 which is an increase of 22% over the past week, though weekly figures have fluctuated. Like elsewhere in Devon</li> </ul>

<ul> <li>Awaiting confirmed data but booster rollout seems to be going well. School children should be offered a dose by November.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Free school meal vouchers - DCC are sending families of nearly 18,000 children in Devon free supermarket vouchers this October half term, worth £15 per child per week.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Foster Carers - DCC is still looking for more Foster Carers in Devon, especially for children with more complex needs. A recruitment campaign will be launched shortly If you know anyone who would be interested, please refer them to this DCC webpage - <u>Child and Parent fostering - Fostering in Devon</u></li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Funding for self-isolating residents – DCC have launched a new fund to help community organisations provide practical, social and emotional support to Devon residents self-isolating due to COVID-19.</li> </ul>

I'm pleased to be able to report at long last that Torridge District Council have a new website. Around 18 months ago a task group consisting of Parish Councillors, TDC officers and Councillors was set up to sift through several web designs and choose one that was both modern, functional and above all easy to navigate. The last few months have seen the chosen web pages being fine tuned and the launch of the website has just taken place. Ease of use is the key. Residents can now check on their accounts 24/7, whether it is to pay a bill, check on their council tax or report a problem. There is even a link to the DCC webpage to report pot holes, lights not working etc. A vast improvement on being constrained by TDC office hours.

#### • Joint Planning Policy Committee

At a recent Full Council meeting Councillors agreed to the proposal to form a Joint Planning Policy Committee consisting of seven Councillors each from N Devon and Torridge. This Committee will supersede the previous Working Group and will have delegated powers which will prevent the need for reports to be taken to each individual Council at key decision making stages of the Local Plan as has historically been the case. However the final adoption of the Local Plan will be referred back as a recommendation by the Joint Committee for a decision as to adoption by each individual Council.

### Waste Collection Services

Due to the recent HGV driver shortage many Authorities are having to suspend, albeit temporally, some waste and recycling collections. Fortunately as at this time Torridge have been able to provide a full service partly as a result of waste and recycling supervisors being HGV drivers.

### • Sensitive material in skip

An incident occurred a couple of weeks ago in Shebbear at the old Beech House Surgery, which is presently being converted into living accommodation, whereby sensitive material such as patient records were deposited in a skip. There were also sharps, chemicals and a quantity of drugs deposited. Fortunately this was seen by a member of the public and 4 residents removed the items and stored them in a safe place. I advised at 5.25pm that 101 be called to assist (after several other routes were explored to no avail). 101 also proved fruitless. Eventually after several more phone calls that evening I emailed the Community Safety and Public Health manager at Torridge and asked that TDC become involved. This duly happened the first thing following morning and the various Authorities were contacted and the materials removed from the skip were safely collected for disposal.

I have contacted the OPCC to ask why 101 were unhelpful to the resident who called. 999 is probably not the way to go for a non emergency situation as we all know this service is pretty stretched. I will be speaking with a Police Officer tomorrow (Thursday) and will ask why more appropriate assistance wasn't given.

## Devon Rail Forum

I represent Torridge on the Devon Rail Forum and I attended the latest meeting recently. Of great interest was the fact that the Dartmoor Line is due to open on Nov 20th. This year will see 2 hourly services between Okehampton and Exeter and 1 hourly
