	<ul> <li>Covid – infections have been rising again, mostly primary school children and younger working age groups. Infection rates for 60+ much lower. Current figures is 209 (3 in HDU) in hospital but this is a downward trend. North Devon has 11 in hospital with no one in HDU.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>There has been investigations into introducing more 20 mph scheme around schools and the A3227 outside Langtree Primary School is one that is being considered.</li> </ul>

	Devon Rail forum	
	I attended via Zoom the Devon rail Forum and was interested to hear that passenger numbers travelling on the recently opened Okehampton to Exeter line had exceeded expectations. The recently introduced bus link from Tavistock to Okehampton to coincide with train times has also assisted with passenger numbers. Students travelling to and from Exeter and Saturday shoppers are at present helping to show that the reopening of the line was the correct decision. There is shortly to be an interruption to services when a bridge is replaced, further trackwork and bank stabilising repairs are carried out. Services will then resume and the 1 hour service will hopefully commence.	
	Informative training for PC'S	
	I recently had a conversation with a PC Chairman with regard to PC's comments about planning applications. The conversation centred about what was appropriate and what wasn't. I agreed to talk with the Planning Manager and ask if some training could be given to PC's. Recently TDC Councillors were invited to attend a virtual session when Enforcement Training was imparted. This training Torridge are looking to deliver virtually via Zoom to Parish Clerks and Chairs of Parish Councils throughout Torridge and I ask you to look out for their e-mail giving more details that will be sent soon? The Planning Officer agreed that it is a good idea to give training regarding planning comments and this	

	training would follow similar lines as to what is stated above.

	Bridge Buildings in Bideford has now been sold, waste and recycling is still coping despite rise in absence due to positive Omicron sickness and as ever at this time of year the Budget discussions for 2022/23 are now taking place. Cold callers are targeting residents in Torridge with offers of free insulation and claim to be working in partnership with TDC. However, Torridge operate a strict 'no cold calling' rule with their partners so if residents have been approached in this way they are advised to be wary and contact Torridge District Council to report the call.
