





- Entry fee is 25p per exhibit. Under 16's free in own classes but they may enter other classes on payment of the fee.
- All entry forms with correct fee to be returned to Old Rectory Langtree or box at the Parish Hall by 9 pm Thursday 16th August
- Exhibits to be staged by 10.30am on 18th August. Doors open at 8am.
- No exhibitors or any other person except judges, stewards and committee members to be present during judging
- Exhibitors must provide own vases, plates etc
- All exhibits of Fruit, Flowers or Vegetables must be grown by

exhibitor. (Except flower arrangements)

- Prizes in each class 1st £1.50p 2nd £1, 3rd 50p. However judges may withhold prizes if there are insufficient entries in any one class or where they think they are not merited.
- The decision of the judges is final.

CARROT CAKE RECIPE (Class 52)

Ingredients

250g/9oz unsalted butter 375g/13oz caster sugar rind of 2 oranges, grated 4 eggs 450g/1lb carrots, grated 150g/5oz walnuts, chopped 1 tbsp vanilla essence juice of 1 orange 250g/9oz plain flour 2 tsp bicarbonate of soda 1 tsp mixed spice 1 tsp salt For the icing: 225g/8oz full fat soft cheese, at room temperature 65g/21/20z unsalted butter, at room temperature 400g/14oz icing sugar, sifted 1 tsp vanilla essence

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/350F/Gas 4.
- 2. Grease a 23cm/9in spring-form cake tin.
- 3. Beat the butter, sugar and orange rind until they are light and fluffy.
- 4. Slowly add the eggs, beating well to incorporate each addition fully before adding more.
- 5. Fold in the grated carrot and chopped nuts.
- 6. Add the vanilla essence and orange juice.
- 7. Finally, sift the flour, bicarbonate of soda, spice and salt together, then fold into the cake mixture.
- 8. Pour the mixture into the prepared spring-form tin and bake in the preheated oven for about 45-60 minutes. The sides of the cake should be coming away from the sides of the cake tin and a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake should come out clean.
- 9. To make the icing, cream the cheese and the butter together until smooth.
- 10. Add the icing sugar and vanilla essence, and beat until smooth. This frosting is rich thick and

Having attended three funerals in three weeks recently I became more aware of the words of a well-known prayer sometimes used on these occasions, namely The Lord's Prayer. The words were, Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive them who trespass against us. When we pay our final respects to someone it's too late to say sorry to them, but for our own wellbeing we still need to forgive the things that hurt & wounded us. The more I think about the words of that prayer, which I suppose the majority of people have said at some point in their lives, the more I realise how challenging and far reaching the words are. Let me quote it from a more modern version, Forgive us the wrongs we have done as (according to the way) we forgive the wrongs that others have done to us. Its hard teaching and most of us have no idea how often we have unwittingly hurt and wounded others. Do we want to be forgiven? Of course we do, then learn to forgive others. It's a tough task and it may seem utterly unfair until we remember another basic rule of the universe, Christian or otherwise. Whatever a person sows, that is also what they reap. It's a law which no one of can avoid or dodge around and we only fool ourselves if we think for whatever reason, somehow or other it will not apply to us. I have to admit I often struggle with these things and sometimes it takes a long time to be able to forgive. It involves looking the incident full in the face and calling it by its rightful name, no excuses or justifying either way, then decisively letting it go, forgiving and leaving the outcome in higher hands than ours, The hands of God Himself, the ultimate judge of us all.

We shall shortly be welcoming a new minister to take charge of this area, his name is Rev Ken Morgan and he will live in Torrington. He is at present living in Cumbria but leaves there in early August and becomes our minister at the beginning of September. We look forward to welcoming him. 

Langtree Parish Hall - by Sue Lee


