



#### Notes from the Parish Council

#### David Ley. Parish Council Chairman

The summer saw the normal run of planning applications, indignant letters to higher authorities and other general matters. Turbine applications raised the activity levels somewhat with a site visit and listening to the views of residents. It would seem that many parishioners are interested in renewable energy and do see the need for it even in Langtree but getting the right thing in the right place is the problem. There are so many conflicting views on impacts, efficiencies and financial rewards it's hard to find a consensus. I wonder what our children will think of the things we have done - or not done.

Things have suddenly become very busy for us with the new local area plan. We are tasked with finding new strategic housing land for the period up to 2031. Both Stibb Cross and Langtree villages are required to have 5 houses each, which is our share of Torridge District Council's allocation. It has to be borne in mind that both settlements have grown by more than that in the past 18 years. This figure does not include houses already past the planning process but not built. We also have to prepare a vision statement; how we would like to see the villages develop. As I am still writing it and consulting with councillors I cannot show you the finished article but we anticipate 5 - 8 new houses in Stibb Cross with a green recreation area and 10 – 15 houses in Langtree, including affordable housing, with an emphasis on encouraging young families that will enable our school to thrive. In particular in Langtree the safety of pedestrians walking to and from school is of concern. A path was to have been built along the edge of Langtree Park by DCC but they have run out of funds. We are trying to find a solution that ties in with the housing plan. Thanks to all those who gave helpful suggestions at the open meeting.

Dog fouling has started to become a problem again with reports of mess on the path outside the school. With a bin just yards away .....need I say more?

Here's hoping for a quieter winter.

Website: www.unioninn-stibbcross.co.uk Email: landlord@unioninn-stibbcross.co.uk Sir, I have been under some pressure in recent months to trim some of my road hedges and I would like to take this opportunity to explain to villagers what our policy is. The hedges in question run north and west from Forches Cross. They and the hedgebanks on which they grow are mediaeval in origin and show the typical curved form produced when ploughmen using oxen had to sweep round at the end of the furrow in order to turn the oxen for the return journey. The hedge running west to our farmhouse from Forches Cross contains at least eleven species and I feel privileged to be the custodian of these ancient structures.

The best way to preserve the hedges is to steep (lay) them every 15-20 years, and to cast up the hedgebanks at that time to repair the gaps caused by livestock etc and re-fence the boundary. This is what I intend to do in due course.

Mature hedges such as these produce huge crops of berries and fruit from hawthorn, blackthorn, spindle, elderberry, beech, holly, hazel and crab apple trees, and provide a tremendous food source for wintering birds particularly thrushes such as fieldfare and redwing. Furthermore they also provide valuable nest sites for nesting birds, and in the hedge running north to Langtree there are two pairs of breeding yellowhammers which are in severe decline nationally.

I hope that villagers will share my feeling that in these circumstances a few stray brambles are worth putting up with for a few months.

As many of you will have heard our president, Mary Nicholls, had a slight stroke last month. We are happy to report that she is well on her way to better health and hopes to return next month.




For the first time for many years we entered the co-operative competition at the Woolsery Show where we finished  $2^{nd}$  and only points behind the winners.

#### Beech House Surgery, Shebbear.

I would like to take this opportunity to communicate with our patients and to thank Tom and everybody involved with the Langtree Magazine. I would also like to thank the Friends of the Practice and the Patient's Participation Group for their support.

At the practice we realise that there are quite a few challenges ahead. Money is tight within the NHS at the moment, even with the best will and ring fencing from the government. We are in a rural area, isolated geographically. We want to continue serving the community with a practice in Shebbear. I would like to personally thank Mrs Maria Guerra who, under difficult circumstances, has filled in a lot of clinics at short notice.

#### Langtree Parish Hall - by Sue Lee

Hoorah! The extension to the Hall is almost complete. All that needs to be done is to order some fixtures and equipment in the next month or so. This will mean that the extra spaces created can really come into their own and be used by both established and new groups. The original project build (excluding fixtures and equipment) was quoted at £93,840 (includes VAT). 51% of this, amounting to £48000, was awarded to us by Leader + and the rest we had earned by fundraising and Hall hire. All the work was done by local builders and trades folk and is a build to be proud of. There have been additions to the original project build including additional concrete in the foundations, a new bar involving extra electrical and plumbing work, a shutter, floor coverings and a patio area, thus the total valuation is £107, 996.60p. We have been very lucky in securing funding of £2500 from the Balsdon Trust and £10,560 from Devon Waste Management for equipment and a generous £1000 from an anonymous donor. This money will be spent on equipment such as a pass through dishwasher for the preparation room, a projector and screen for the proposed new film club, a double door fridge, leisure equipment such as table tennis table and short mat bowls mat for use by Langtree primary school and others. Tables suitable for purpose will need to be purchased for both the room behind the kitchen and that in front of the bar. The extension lacks a name and at Committee we have come up with a few ideas such as The Halifax room as it overlooks the fields where the Halifax bomber crash landed, the Leader room after our principal grant provider or the Patio Room for obvious reasons! We are having an open afternoon on 13<sup>th</sup> October from 2pm to 5pm where you can come and see the new facilities, have complimentary tea and cake or maybe a drink from the new bar. Perhaps you are considering holding a celebration of some sort or starting up a new group- do come along and view!
