

#### Notes from the Parish Council

Still the rain keeps falling and the wind keeps blowing. Trees have been tested and blocked drains lost under deep water. Nevertheless our parish fairs reasonably well under such conditions because we mainly occupy high or sloping land known as a culm ridge. How fortunate we are not to live on a flood plain. The experts tell us that all our concrete, tarmac, roofs and drains might help us but the surge of water can cause problems for those on lower ground that are prone to flooding. More trees, porous parking areas, ponds and systems to release the water slowly are what we need to be doing. As usual, this costs money but I have a feeling it will become part of the conditions of planning permission in the future.

At least we haven't had to deal with slippery roads and pavements yet. But still our roads have taken another battering and potholes are beginning to appear. Contact the clerk if you think there is a problem as he is well versed in reporting them to DCC.

Last year was a hectic time for a normally peaceful parish council with future housing sites to find for the Northern Devon Area Plan which has yet to be finalised despite being well behind the original schedule. I am more hopeful of seeing progress on the site next to the hall now. Like all new developments it will not be popular with everyone but will certainly improve the visual aspect from the hall and provide much requested affordable homes for our younger residents. Our job now is to try and find funding for the sports facility for the whole thing to begin.

#### Langtree Parish Hall – by Sue Lee

Hoorah! The extension to the Hall is complete. We had an opening night back in November which was attended by representatives from each user group, builders and the grant providers. All the fixtures and fittings are now in place and it is hoped that with the new projector and screen we will be able to hold the occasional film night in the extension which incidentally is named The Leader Room after our main grant providers. We were particularly fortunate in that we were awarded an additional £10,108 from the Leader project as some projects came under budget. Pat Mitchell and I attended a showcase of some of the projects funded at Bishop's Nympton Parish Hall. £3.628 million was awarded over 5 years to Torridge and North Devon as part of European Rural Development fund and 192 projects in North Devon and Torridge have benefitted. These include small businesses, community halls, museums and heritage projects such as that at Fremington Quay. Our total grant money from Leader 4 was £58,108.

The Hall is now on Wi-Fi and a new web site is being developed. Our annual general meeting was held back in November when the annual accounts for the year ending September 2013 were presented. These are published in the newsletter. Some grant money had not been credited to the account at this stage so this is why the bank balance looks a little low!

At the time of writing the pantomime is being performed. For those who enjoy live theatre there are a couple of interesting events being held at the Hall by Torrington Players. On March 2<sup>nd</sup> and March 9<sup>th</sup> at 7pm there is Talking Heads written by Alan Bennett. More details in the newsletter. Then on the afternoon of 12<sup>th</sup> April from 3pm - 4pm Torrington players are introducing Oh What a Lovely War-which will be performed in November at The Plough. They are hoping to inspire folk to join as performers, be part of the production team and or do local research on those in the Parish involved in any way in the First World War. More details in the newsletter.

We are again one of the venues for North Devon's Big Breakfast in aid of the Hospice. Our date is 9<sup>th</sup> March. If you can help in any way please let me know (I have a list!) If you are coming to enjoy a full English breakfast with cereal, fruit, juice please book if you can. We are also hoping to organise open gardens again. This has been pencilled in for Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> June but more arrangements need to be made before this is a definite.

This will be a ticketed event and open to all. There are a number of private celebrations being held at the hall through March and April including 3 children's birthday parties, 2 golden weddings, 2 diamond weddings and end of season celebrations.

#### Langtree History Group Mike Roe

Since my last report on the History Group's activities back in July we have been quietly busy adding to our varied collection of photographs, newspaper cuttings and postcards to add to our growing archives. We keep on finding fascinating snippets of information about our parish and the residents. All of these seemingly minor pieces of information when added together grow to create the bigger picture of parish life past and present.

One major find was a folder containing pictures and drawings by Sheila Scouler. This was rescued from a skip in Stratton following a house clearance! Many of the superb illustrations are line drawings, with detailed captions, of life in, and around, Torrington since the dark ages. The folder also contained a large number of paintings, on a variety of subjects, which are of superb quality. We have been lucky in that this folder was rescued and has been presented to our group for safe keeping.

The most important subject which the group is currently monitoring and recording is the planning application for the wind turbine and we will also be recording details of similar developments in neighbouring parishes. We, as a group, are neither for, nor against the applications and are just recording the facts as part of the parish history records that we keep.

This is the time of year when we not only review the past but look forward to the future.

This year sees the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the start of World War 1. As part of this anniversary we are hoping to record as much information as possible about the part played by our parish and it's people during that time. Sadly there will be nobody still alive who can give us their memories directly but many of you may well have relatives who can remember details or stories, however incomplete, told by parents or relatives, regarding parish life, or someone's part in the war during those years. Other projects will include ongoing monitoring and recording of planning applications which may have a significant effect on our parish, the completion of the recording of the grave details for Siloam Chapel, and ongoing collections of photographs, post cards and press cuttings.
