




In January 1948, a special Parish Meeting was called to "consider what steps should be taken towards the erection of a memorial to the fallen of the Parish in the 1939-45 Great War". It was proposed that a tablet be created similar to the one already in the Church. At a Parish Meeting in March 1950 it was explained that the reason for the delay was that fresh instructions for the inscription had to be given to the makers, as it had been overlooked that one of the fallen had been a female.

Christmas pudding with brandy butter

Dominic Chapman

Ingredients Christmas pudding

115g of self-raising flour 110g of white breadcrumbs 110g of suet

250g of soft brown sugar

1/2 tsp of ground mixed spice 1/4 tsp of grated nutmeg

1/4 tsp of cinnamon

50g of nibbed almonds

90g of dates, stones removed

125g of raisins

125g of sultanas

125g of currants

25g of mixed peel

1 Bramley apple, peeled & grated

1 orange, juiced and zested

1 lemon, juiced and zested

3 eggs

75ml of rum

75ml of brandy

75ml of Guinness

100g of golden syrup

Brandy butter

100g of unsalted butter, softened 225g of icing sugar brandy to taste

To plate

200ml of double cream, brandy



- 1. To prepare the pudding mix, sift the flour into a bowl and combine with the breadcrumbs, suet, almonds, sugar and spices
- 2. Remove the stones from the dates, chop the flesh and combine with the remaining fruits. Add to the flour mixture and mix well
- 3. Whisk the eggs together and add to the 7. pudding mixture with the rum, brandy, Guinness and golden syrup. Stir thoroughly to combine
- 4. Leave the mix in the fridge for 1 week to $_{8.}$ develop its flavour. During this time, taste the mixture occasionally - more spices or alcohol can be added if required
- 5. To cook the pudding, butter and flour a pudding basin, then fill it 3/4 of the way up the 9. side with the mixture. Place a circle of parchment paper on top of the mixture, cover the basin with tin foil and seal tightly
- 6. Place in a steamer and steam the pudding for 4 hours. Once cooked, allow to cool and store tightly wrapped in the fridge or a cool place

until required. To reheat the puddings, return to the steamer and steam for a further 2 hours

- To prepare the brandy butter, add the butter to a large bowl and allow to soften. Once soft enough to beat, whisk the butter until light and creamy
- Add the icing sugar and beat again until all of the sugar is mixed in, then whisk in the brandy, tasting to achieve the right balance of sweetness and alcohol. Store the butter in the fridge until required
- Serve the reheated Christmas pudding with a good dollop of brandy butter or some cream. If desired, turn down the lights, splash some more brandy over the hot pudding and set it alight!

The Men's Shed movement in Torrington and district is very much on the move! An enthusiastic core of "Shedders" is wading steadily through the bureaucratic necessities of writing a constitution, setting up trustees, becoming a charity and writing grant applications. With expert support and

advice from Jo Manley, the Group Development Worker from Torridge Voluntary Services, we are making progress.

We are working hard to raise fund to finance suitable and affordable premises for a Shed and are considering all possible options. What are we ideally looking for ? Briefly, a building in or really close to Torrington with easy access from both Torrington and the surrounding area; and large enough to house several workbenches with electricity, water, toilet and somewh ere to make a cup of tea. This is our ideal but in the short-term we could live with less in order to get the Shed going. As we get going, we will continue to look for donations of old tools for use or repair as well as other equipment and materials. If you think you can help us with any of these, do get in touch.

As a reminder, the Men's Sheds movement started in Australia in the 1990's and has grown steadily in the U.K. A Men's Shed offers men the chance to meet in a relaxed way to pursue practical interests and at the same time do something fulfilling and useful. Activities can include woodwork, repairing tools and garden equipment, bicycles, toys and the like. A successful Men's Shed can offer a social and friendly outlet for men who wish to do something interesting and useful, either by using and passing on existing skills or learning new ones. Men's Sheds often link with charities to provide useful tools where needed, both at home and overseas.

Dear Friends.

The churchyard is a precious space. It's a place of memories, as many come and recall those they have known, and, in many cases, still miss. Those memories can be of people back over the generations. It's a place of rest and peace, where those who feel the pain of loss can come and take time out. It's a place of hope, where with a place of worship in its midst, we can know the hope that God offers to us in the resurrection of Jesus.

It is good to see so many here who take time in our churchyard, who tend graves and for whom it is a significant place. To that end there are plans to enhance further this special place. First, that is to tidy it up — especially the area at the top of the churchyard. Often old wreathes are left there, broken vases, etc. We have sought before to clear this area, and have provided bins. But still the mess seems to reappear. Please, do take it away, don't just dump it. It makes the place very unsightly.

But then too the thought is to improve the churchyard. Not by letting it go wild with brambles and so on, as some of the 'wilder' stories would have it that have been circulating. No, rather to nurture more wild flowers - as has already happened in the spring with snowdrops and primroses and bluebells. In two small areas at the top of the churchyard, with no graves in them, this would be extended to summer flowers. This would too encourage butterflies and so on. In a country churchyard, new life is nurtured.

This all needs care and management – it cannot be a matter of leaving it just to grow. And if it doesn't work in our particular churchyard, then the whole approach will be re-thought.
