Allotments and a Community Garden

Following several local requests, Langtree Parish Council is entering into an agreement whereby we will be leasing the land to the south side of The Crescent. This is currently an eyesore of overgrown scrub and the plan is to provide the Parish with a small number of allotments and a community garden. Both endeavours will be on a self-help basis. We already have a core volunteer base for the construction and maintenance of a community garden, and interest has been shown for allotments. Anticipated date for when the land will be ready to start cultivation is 1st October 2016. It will not affect the local residents who currently park their cars on part of this land.

For obvious financial reasons the Parish Council cannot fully fund this venture and we will be relying heavily upon volunteer support. The allotments will have course have a minimal rental liability but it will not be excessive. If you are interested in an allotment or help with a garden please contact me, Mike Evans, the Parish Clerk at Withacott Bungalow, Langtree, in writing, so that I can maintain a known contact base of interested parties.

CHURCH NEWS - A service to celebrate the Queen's 90th birthday was held on a beautiful Sunday evening in June. The Service was conducted by the Rev. Julie Cartwright, the NDDH Chaplain. It was based on service. Hymns was selected by members from both the Church and the Chapel. Geoff Folland read the Lesson, David Hill read stories of other people's service to their communities, I read the piece David Attenborough read at the Abbey, Margaret Knapman read the Prayers and Stephen Males entertained us before and after the service with patriotic music. The PCC would like to thank all the people who helped in any way at the Sunday lunch in the Hall. It was a lovely day Good Food Good Company and Weather. We send our especial thanks to Sue Lee because without her it would not have happened. Thank You Sue. A magnificent sum of £1700 was raised for the Churchyard. We try to keep the churchyard tidy and the grass short. We have the grass mown 12 times between March & September, but never when we have all the primroses flowering by the main gate. Some of our members have bought nest boxes and 6 have been placed in the trees. Four have residents already, a sparrow and a wren. Two others are occupied but we are not sure of the variety. Over the next few weeks we shall be having work done on some of our trees. Some sycamore on the north hedge will be removed so that more light will be available to the residents of "Shamrock". Also we are waiting for the Tree Specialist from TDC to visit and

inform us whether one of our old Beech trees needs removing or if there is any remedial work can be attempted. If it has to be removed Dragon Hill will have to be closed for two days to everyone including walkers.

Some will have noticed that there is work ongoing in the Church. A large section of wall was hanging on the stones and was imminent of collapsing. To replace we have to abide by Listed Buildings criteria which means we have to use lime plaster in three coats & allow each coat to completely dry between coats.

It has been reported that some children are using the churchyard as a cycle track. Can we ask them not to do this as it is disrespectful to families who have loved ones buried there.

The Harvest Festival Service will be on Sunday 9th at 11am. Followed by Lunch and the auction in the Hall. The Carol service will be on Sunday December 18th at 6.00pm followed by mince Pies.

District Councillor David Hurley

I have previously mentioned the state of our local roads including Greeny Lane even though this is not in my Shebbear and Langtree Ward. I know of many people who no longer use this “road” because of the very poor state of the surface. I'm sure many of you too are aware of the appalling condition of this road. I spoke with a DCC Officer recently who said that my concerns would be passed onto the County Councillor responsible for this area (Andy Boyd). If you feel strongly about the poor state of this road would you please contact andy.boyd@devon.gov.uk stating your concerns.

On the same theme of roads, I was driving to Shebbear last week to meet with another County Councillor and I noticed lines sprayed on the road to identify where repairs are necessary. It occurred to me that many lines have also been sprayed on the surface of Greeny Lane but this was some weeks ago and, at the time of writing, nothing has happened in respect of repairs. I mentioned to the County Councillor that if repairs to roads so marked are not carried out within a reasonable time after the identification lines have been sprayed, weather permitting, DCC Highways Department will lose all credibility in the eyes of the Public. I don't believe that their standing is too high at this time anyway in view of all the potholes that exist in our roads. Why make public opinion any worse?

I mentioned in the last edition of Langtree News the proposal for allotments/Community garden on an area known as Butts Meadow in the Crescent. As I stated before, the area had been looked at by TDC and has been included in the Local Plan which has been submitted for approval by the Secretary of State. At a previous public meeting between Langtree Parish Council, Andrew Waite (Property Manager at TDC) and residents interested in establishing a Community Garden, it was stated that the land at Butts Meadow, together with other suitable plots, was suitable for housing. This was not saying that housing was going to be built there, just the possibility of such an event at some time in the future. This is part of what is known as Councils having to show that they have identified a five year supply of land for building purposes. Ultimately local needs will decide where and when housing is built. When the houses at Langtree Meadows next to the Parish Hall are completed, this I am told, should fulfil the development need in Langtree for the near (immediate) future.

The Butts Meadow news caused some consternation for the residents who were proposing a community garden as it was not clear if they would be able to use the land for their project. I asked Andrew Waite of TDC, together with a request that was sent in a letter from the Parish Council, to a meeting to explain what the situation regarding the community garden/allotments was. At my suggestion, he agreed that a Lease could be drawn up between TDC and Langtree PC to allow residents to use Butts Meadow as a community garden/allotments facility subject to certain terms and conditions. Two weeks later, I asked Mr Waite if he would prioritise some time and send a Head Lease to Langtree PC for consideration. Permission for projects such as these can often take some considerable time to obtain. In my discussions with Mr Waite I advised that the

project had already lost the use of the land for this year, and, if the ground was not prepared shortly, next year may also be lost. I am pleased to say that my request, and the meetings and my perseverance on the subject, was met with a positive response at TDC and the Head Lease was accepted at the Parish Council meeting in July. Hopefully all paperwork will be in place for work to commence at Butts Meadow in October this year. I feel this is an excellent outcome.

In case you haven't heard about Torrington District Council's New Homes Bonus Community Grants scheme which commenced on 1 April 2016, there is a Ward pot of £10,000 and a Community pot of £200,000. At the time of writing there have been 8 successful bids for Ward pot funding and 9 applications have scored the required points to be taken to the Council's Community & Resources Committee. Of these applications, three were granted funding at a total cost of around £76,000. The remaining six will now wait until any further applications are received and scored. The applications that receive the required points will then be taken, along with the remaining six aforementioned, to the next C&R meeting where funding will be allocated to the top scoring projects.
