## **District Councillor David Hurley**

Hello once again. The year is, as ever, flying by. The very warm temperatures that we experienced earlier this year, have, like the swallows, all but disappeared. If we are to believe some weather forecasters we are in for a harsh winter.

I must say that I was very pleased to see that Greeny lane had some well overdue remedial work done to the road surface recently. This is the road that connects the B3227 at Watergate to the A388 Torrington to Okehampton road and is much used by vehicles, including cars, farm vehicles and heavy lorries. This, together with the work carried out in Fore Street Langtree, was well overdue and is a prelude to further Skanska activity on both roads next year I'm told.

The by-election at Harland I reported in the last edition of this magazine duly took place and Richard Boughton was the successful Conservative candidate. Unfortunately a few weeks later we lost Councillor Ken Carroll due to illness. Ken was a dedicated Councillor and will be sadly missed. This of course means that another by-election is to be held, this time for the Holsworthy Ward.

The Langtree Meadows development is now gaining momentum. I know that the selling agents, Webbers, were pleased with the attendance at the Open Morning held in September. Applications are now in to purchase one of these properties and the deadline to apply is 27th October. After that the lucky applicants will be notified that they have been successful and they will move into their new homes. It's been a long time coming but now seems worth the wait. The houses are, in my opinion, well finished and sit in a position that gives wonderful views from their upstairs rear windows across to Barnstaple (on a clear day) and beyond. Applicants for further properties becoming available soon should make themselves known to Rachel Webdell at TDC by calling 01237 428750.

In case you haven't heard, or read about it, the new Local Plan has been signed off by the Planning Inspector and now needs to be adopted by both TDC and North Devon Councils. This should be the case when both Councils meet at the same venue in late October. This plan has been a long time coming and it is a relief that the Inspector is now happy with the proposals. What this means is that both TDC and N Devon can now demonstrate what is known as a 5 year land supply. This in turn means that Planners will now have more powers to turn down predatory applications that seek to build where it is not suitable or are outside designated village boundary lines. There are, of course, some last minute planning applications being submitted that will still have to be dealt with under the old plan. Hopefully not too many of these will be presented to the planners. I, for one, cannot wait for the Plans adoption to take place.

The Transformation Programme at Torridge continues unabated. Riverbank House edges nearer completion and the Legal and HR teams will have moved to their new and updated accommodation prior to this edition of Langtree News being published. Jane Whittaker (Council Leader) and myself have been based at the Town Hall in Bideford for the past couple of months due to the noise and upheaval at Riverbank House, so it will be good to move back to our proper office.

I note that the pavillion behind the Parish Hall in Langtree is nearing completion and, with the recent rainfall, the ground adjacent to it earmarked for a soccer pitch is progressing nicely. A call has been made asking for parties interested in using these facilities to come forward. It has taken a long time to reach this stage so it would be good if there was a positive response.

At the time of writing the fitting out of the changing room with toilets, showers changing area and boiler room is nearing completion. Also happening is the removal of a window in the skittle area and being replaced by a patio door with access onto a paved area and to the changing room. All this work needs to be completed by the end of October to secure the grants. There will be a formal opening afternoon but in the meantime the facilities will be open on 11 th November when there will be lunch and music for those attending commemoration of WW1 and remembering the fourteen Langtree men who died. 
A Christmas craft fare will be held on Sunday 25 th November from 10am - 3pm

Dear Friends,

It was the Great War, the War to end all wars. And at last it was over. November 11th, 1918. 4 years of bloodshed and frustration and ineptitude. Millions dead across Europe; the civilised nations of the world having fought themselves to a standstill. 100 years ago the Armistice at last took effect. The guns stood silent.

People could breathe again. No longer was there fear of what news the telegram would bring. Soldiers – those that remained – could return to their homes, their families, their land. The bells rang out in celebration. There was now the chance of a fresh start, of putting all this death and warfare behind and building a new world. Never again would this happen. This was the War to end all wars.

And yet, only 20 years later and Europe – and now the whole world (it really was a world war this time) - was plunged into even more horrendous evil. How could this be? Had we learnt nothing? How could we let this happen all over again?

For many it was the final nail in the coffin of faith. God – if he existed at all – really wasn't interested in the human race. He had left us to our own devices. It really was up to us. But if that is the case, how terrifying is that. If that is what we can do to each other – and it doesn't show any signs of abating – then there really isn't much hope. Which is maybe why so many simply live for themselves. In this world, it can seem like the only thing worth living for.

Remembrance forces us to be humble. Humanity really can be that bad. And nothing we do seems to change that, be it education, being better off, having better health care, living longer, or anything else. Maybe if what happens around us can't make the difference, maybe it is what is in us that can. And that's where God can come in. He can change us on the inside – and that can make all the difference – not just in the world, but in our own lives and communities too.

The Parish Council is pleased to advise that they have received a grant of £700 from Balsdon Trust which will be used towards planting 14 trees to commemorate the 100 year anniversary of the end of the First World War. 14 has been chosen as this was the number of men from the Langtree area who died during the war and are shown on the war memorial inside the Langtree Parish Church. The type of trees that will be planted and their final location will be agreed at the next Parish Council meeting on 11th October 2018.

## Night Landing Light for Devon Air Ambulance



In time for the clock's going back and the nights getting longer a Night Landing Light for Devon Air Ambulance will have been installed and commissioned at the rear of Langtree Parish Hall. The installation is a 10 metre high post with a light on the top directed at floodlighting the centre circle of the new football pitch.

The helicopter pilot will through his mobile phone switch on the light as he comes into land and then switch it off again as he leaves. The site was chosen as it is flat and has good access to the roads through the Parish Hall carpark for the use of ambulances. Devon Air Ambulance now has a site that can service the local areas of Langtree, Stibb Cross, Frithelstock and beyond.

The landing light could not have been installed without the significant contributions raised from the community through events at the Parish Hall, a joint bid by Frithelstock and Langtree Parish Councils for Communities Together Funding and a grant from Devon Air Ambulance Trust.

It is planned to have a proper switching-on celebration in due course.

### **Keeping Children Safe: Security Fencing and Site Entry**

Our Summer Holiday Project. Fencing and gates that surround and secure a school typically meet a wide variety of important criteria, from preventing unauthorised entry to the grounds and controlling the flow of people around a site; protecting pupils, staff and visitors from accidents and injury; deterring theft and reducing the risk of malicious damage as well as making sure that even our youngest children stay safely on our site once they have arrived. Governors here have spent a lot of time considering all of these aspects of Langtree School over the last year or so, and recently made the decision to change the way the main entrance (via the Parish Hall Car Park) operates. During the Summer Holiday, we had contractors working here to put up additional fencing and gates to help direct visitors to the School Office, limiting options to wander across our site. At the beginning and end of the school day, unlocked gates will give families unrestricted access to classrooms or cloakrooms but shortly after the bell has been rung signalling the start of the school day, all gates are secured leaving only one option for access: via the Office/Reception entrance.
