Support for vulnerable people who are 'shielding'

The NHS has identified people who have a high risk of getting severely ill if they catch coronavirus (COVID-19), because of their underlying health conditions.

Devon County Council have updated the information on their website about support for this extremely vulnerable group, including how to register on the Government website. If you are in this group, you may have received a letter or text message from the NHS or been contacted by your GP. The Government will arrange free weekly delivery of food direct to your house, and you can request other sorts of help available to you locally as well.

Helpline for people who have received an NHS Extremely Vulnerable letter

If residents have received an NHS extremely vulnerable letter, registered for support on the Government website but they have not received a food delivery, or they need other help because they are isolated then they can call: Devon Coronavirus Emergency Helpline 0345 155 1011.

Information about grant and funding support

We understand that there may be grants available for care workers, community organisations, businesses and individuals, charities, hospitality industry, sports sector, and grants for the arts industry. Information on these grants have been brought together on the Devon County Council coronavirus webpages.

Local shopping details

Many people are buying food and necessities through the supermarkets but we know that getting suitable delivery slots can be very difficult. We thought it would be useful for you to know the names and phone details of some of the local shops. Some of these will take card payments and may even be able to make home deliveries but you will need to contact them to find out. If they cannot deliver, you should be able to order and pay for your goods and ask a neighbour or one of the parish volunteers to collect items on your behalf.

How To Safely Dispose Of Waste

The following information about waste disposal has been given to us by TDC.

- KEEP YOUR WASTE INSIDE FOR AT LEAST 72 HOURS AND DOUBLE BAG THE WASTE.
- Store personal waste (like used tissues) and disposable cleaning cloths securely in rubbish bags.
- Place these bags within a second bag, tie it securely and store it in a separate room from where you are self-isolating.
- Keep the bags there for AT LEAST 72 HOURS before putting them out after 6pm on the night before your usual collection day.
- Recycling and garden waste can be placed in your usual bins.

• Please keep recycling if you can, but please keep your recycling for at least 72 hours after your self-isolating period.

As individuals and communities, we urge you to keep safe and vigilant in the current environment and look out for scams in your neighbourhood, which often target elderly and vulnerable people.

Doorstep Crime

There are many genuine community groups and charities that are assisting the most vulnerable, however, be alert for individuals who may be taking money underthe false pretence of helping.

There have been reports of thieves extorting money from consumers by claiming they are collecting donations for a COVID-19 'vaccine'.

Refund Scams

Some companies are offering fake holiday refunds for individuals who have been forced to cancel their trips. People seeking refunds should also be wary of fake websites set up to claim holiday refunds.

Financial Scams

Criminals are seeking to take advantage of the financial uncertainty many people are facing. These include calls/emails pretending to be from your bank, mortgage or internet provider, as well as increases in loan shark activity.

How To Stay Safe

- If you need help, try and use people you know and trust. If you cannot do this, always ask the person for ID, preferably in the form of a driving licence and make a note of their details
- Don't assume everyone is genuine. It is okay to say no and refuse an offer
- Don't open links or attachments from suspicious emails or text messages
- Never give out your personal bank details, pin, passwords to anyone over the phone, online or on your doorstep
- Don't ring the number the caller has given you to check it's genuine. Always try to look the number up for yourself
- If buying online, only make payments if there is a padlock symbol in the browser window frame and you have carefully checked the site and website address for inconsistencies
- If you are unsure, please seek advice from someone you know and trust
